FROM THE SUPER – AUGUST, 2021

Greetings to all of the Clinton River Division members from the superintendent. I hope this newsletter/August meeting minutes finds you well, especially if you could not attend the meeting either in-person or via Zoom.

Our first in-person meeting at the Troy Christian Chapel along with broadcasting the meeting via Zoom was an outstanding success. We returned to our normal in-person format of show and tell first, followed by the business meeting. With our borrowed computer and corded webcam, **thanks John Jackson**, we were able to have everyone at Troy Christian Chapel present their Show and Tell item to the in-person participants as well as to our Zoom participants via the corded webcam. Zoom participants were

then able to present their show and tell items as we were projecting Zoom onto the screen via the Division's AV projector. Bandwidth was not a problem utilizing the church's Wi-Fi which had been the major concern. With the success of our trial run we will likely request to make an equipment investment to support Zoom broadcasting of our meetings as well as having a Division owned computer that can support all potential media that clinicians will utilize. Unsupported clinician media created disruptions at times and led to last-second clinic cancellations (of course this actually happened again this month as our borrowed computer did not have a DVD drive). The only equipment specifically desired to support a continued Zoom meeting option is a Bluetooth microphone, external amplified speakers as well as a cordless GoPro camera. It was previously discussed to purchase a Division-owned computer, but no action was taken at the time to pursue the purchase. The BOD will discuss the results of the August Zoom experiment at our quarterly BOD meeting in September. If BOD approved, this expenditure will likely be presented to the membership for approval in September as well.

Reminding everyone again, we are implementing a mentoring program within the Division that will give members the opportunity to share areas of personal knowledge as well as request assistance from those members with knowledge in areas where they need help.

In either scenario the members themselves can use the file as a resource to gain or share knowledge. Over time this may lead to some additional AP awards for people, although that will be an additional benefit to the mentorship program and Achievement Program participation is not a requirement.

Jim Zinser, MMR - displayed a Milwaukee Road coach from a Copper Country Limited which ran from Chicago to Copper Harbor, having trackage rights on Jim's Copper Valley Railway.

Larry Wolohon, MMR - built this "O" scale Harriman coach

John Racey - built a 50' Railway Express Agency refrigerator car from Kinsman Scale Models Kit in "S" scale, added Kadee couplers. It needs passenger trucks as the prototype had.




Phil Doolittle - brought his Budd RDC-1 (Rail Diesel Car) by Rapido in CN colors




George Anderson displayed an On30 Combine (and a coach) by Bachman, relettered them from PRR to Hancock & Calumet. He also displayed a book about private passenger cars "Mansions on Rails" by Lucius Beebe.



Rad Jones has a history of the African American railroad attendants, "Those Pullman Blues." The book also covers the role of President Lincoln in expanding the railroads in the United States.



Irv Chmielewski modeled a "shorty" business car, an "Oscar" kit from Walthers in the 1970s. After 50 years, he is almost finished, having modified the interior, removed a bathroom, added seats. Couplers have been replaced, awaiting new trucks and wheel sets.



Terry Bossick - displayed an "O" scale Birney street car. Terry says he represents the "electrical" contingent!



Jerry Shanek - brought his "G" scale model of GHW Bush's funeral car from the UP. The baggage car carried the Bush casket and escort. The lead locomotive in the train was UP 4141 in Air Force colors, the only UP locomotive ever painted in non-UP colors. It is a special treasure for Jerry as his father and President Bush were friends in the military.
