



Dave Katona - The scratch-built scale house for the scale track at the Tawas City yard, per photo. Hopefully by the next meeting it will be painted and installed on the layout. The scale track will be an active part of operations, using Boulder Creek Engineering's scale track readout which generates a random number within the car's weight range, activated when a car is on the scale.





Phil Doolittle - mock up of one option for how to arrange track and industries in the town that will be called Oxbridge on the Desmond Oxbridge & Orillia, or DOO Line railroad. The mockup is about 45 or 46 inches directly below where everything will be when finished. I like planning in full size because there are fewer unpleasant surprises when trying to fit everything in the final construction and installation. This is just the initial idea for track and building arrangement. I expect to try others before settling on the design.

Steve Weber -current project is a 90' steel girder turntable kit by Custom Model Railroads. It is installed in the layout with auto-reversing unit wired in. Alignment is by visual spotting.

Tim also displayed circuit breakers from his old layout, now installed on the new layout. The breakers are Power Shield from Tony's Train Exchange. They shut off short circuits before a short gets to the command station and shuts down the whole railroad. Each board has two breakers. The inputs are the black and yellow wires at the top of the board. The yellow wires at the bottom of the board go to the red leads leading to sets of track ON-OFF toggles that in turn lead to track sections.

Greg Rich, MMR, shared photos of the changing methods of shipping autos from plant to distributors and dealers. (From Internet research)






