

Fred Cosgrove acquired 3-D models by Eric Diehl. All prototype cars operated on Michigan railways in the 1910s. The longest carbody a 1914 Brill, at 66'10". The arched window car is a 51' Nile/ Stephenson built in 1908.

Jim Zinser, MMR, remembers childhood rides on these DSR PCC cars. This model by Corgi.





track.






Tim Fisher found an article in August 1959 Model Railroader about scratch building traction models in 1/4" Scale.

INDY JUNCTION 2022 REPORT

Scott Kremer, MMR, Chairman of the Indy Junction 2022 Convention reported about the May convention via Zoom. The total attendance was over 500. Fifty-one layouts were open for tours at no extra charge to all registrants. The numerous clinics were well-attended. The "yard sale" generated \$12,000 in total sales for the sellers. The Train Show drew fewer vendors than hoped, as most vendors concentrate their efforts to online sales, rather than traveling to shows and conventions. The participating Regions, the North Central, the Mid Central and the Midwest, plus the Railroad Prototype Modelers all recouped their seed money and additional \$3,400 to each group. From attendance and finances, the Convention was successful.

The NMRA Board has voted to have a National Convention with a 4-day format starting in 2025, from the week-long model that has been in place for many years. Indy Junction 2022 has been successful in presenting a more affordable convention without sacrificing quality and fun!
