




SHOW & TELL - SEPTEMBER 2022 - BOXCARS REVISITED or Current Projects



Mark Mincek displayed his B&O M-50 experimental boxcar, built by the railroad in 1935. It was an experiment in high strength corrugated steel with reduced weight and higher capacity. Only one car was built.

John Martin brought his Pennsy "turtle top" 40' box, X-31, used for hauling Jeeps.





Dan Lewis, MMR - showed several boxcars from his railroad, this a Milwaukee outside sheathed box. Other boxcars displayed included auto box, ribsides, double doors.




Larry Wolohon, MMR - brought two boxcars, 1/4" scale AAR SP and AAR UP modified box (it was 6" higher for autos). He also displayed a book about 1937 AAR boxcars. (One boxcar shown)



Greg Rich, MMR - built and detailed this boxcar for his railroad, an ambroid kit from LaBelle, using dry transfer lettering from Irv Schulz 125 Line (no longer available) and adding end doors.



Irv Chmielewski scratch built this 1870 coaling shed used in Santa Fe branchlike service. This is Irv's first scratch build!



Dave Cook - current project is this green 40' wood box car.





OCTOBER 2022 MODEL RAILROAD CONVENTION - KALAMAZOO/BATTLE CREEK, MI

The NMRA NCR Division 9 is hosting a Model Railroad Convention over two days (OCT 28/29, 2022) which will include layout tours, clinics, a special dinner and hopefully some operating session, all of this is over a Friday afternoon through Saturday time frame. The location is in the Kalamazoo and Battle Creek area of Michigan. The Kalamazoo Model Railroad Club will be hosting their annual fall train show and sale on the Sunday (Oct 30) of that weekend if you would like to attend that also.
