



Built A Woodland Scenics Mini Scene




Inserted The Mini Scene In An Appropriate Place

 - Some turf and dirt


AND The Modeler Used An Old CD As A Base

A set of camper figures I received for Father's Day




Trees Are Good, Especially If They Are Already Made



Some Ground Foam Turf




Start By Putting Tape Over The CD Hole






Formed A Small Hill From The Pink Foam


Shape the hill to fit the CD I made one side into a sort of rock face



Spread Some Spackling Over The CD



Shape A Couple Small Bumps For Terrain



Paint Rock Face Black



Coat Everything With A Terrain Colored Paint Add A Couple Colors Of The Fine Turf



I Then Added The Campers (A fathers day present that NEEDED a place)



Added Some Trees

Glued them into the foam, both on the big hill and the bumps



Put The Scene Onto The Hill It is not glued into place



Some Interest Has Been Added To A Flat Nothing Of A Hill






Now For The Uninteresting Stretch Of Track





Select Some Stuff To Use



Again, Trees Are Good



Some Ground Foam Turf



Started with the foam



Made one side into a rock face by scoring and breaking off bits



Shaped The Piece Into A Curve On The Non-Rockface Side



Cut Plastic Into A Bit Longer Shape



Painted A Pond Onto The Plastic

Use three dabs of color just smeared together



Painted The Hill An Appropriate Base Color



Added A Coat Of Gloss Mod Podge



Fitted The Foam Hill And Glued Fake Fur On For Weeds



Checked the fit



Added Ground Foam To The Hill And Trimmed The Fake Fur



Add A Few Trees



A small addition that made a point of interest



That Has Lead Me To Look For Other Simple and Easy Scenery Projects



Are there Other Areas That Need Something



Simply added half inch pieces of a fallen tree branch



A Change To Help Tell The Story Of My Tourist Railroad Running Through A Logged Area



Meeting Expectations

- Added small scenes to forgotten areas on the layout
- About three hours spent for each of the projects
- Cheap
 - The cost for the Camping scene was the camper figures that were a present from a daughter
 - The cost of everything else I figured at ZERO since it was stuff that I had in my scrap piles and a bit of ground cover, already made trees, and dabs of paint.

Outcome

- The camping scene fits so well that it may become a long term fixture on the layout (But it could move to another spot).
- I have already identified where I might move the pond when I start adding a passing siding (But it could just be thrown out when no longer needed).
- Also started to identify other areas that could benefit from cheap and easy scenery updates.
