





Tim Fisher Stacked Pictures

During the past month, Tim took focus stacked photos of his layout for use during the 2025 Convention. At the recommendation of Dave Katona, an Olympus OM 4/3 camera was acquired which will take and stack 3 to 15 images shifting focus from front to back. The



output is an 8 MB JPEG file along with the various focus images. During World War II, the Santa Fe Plains Division used 4-8-4s on most freight trains. Here 3783 enters the double track at Pampa, Texas while 2-10-2 number 940 switches the refinery. 940 was one of the first 2-10-2s and were assigned work as helpers on grades and sometimes switching as shown.

Also displayed were two models of the 3776 Class 4-8-4, 10 engines built 1940. Number 3783 was built with friction bearings and heavy side rods. The wartime 2900 Class with 30 additional engines were built to this specification. The model is a Hallmark Super Crown with factory paint. Number 3784 was one of two built with roller bearing axles and rods with a stack extension for improved draft. After 1945, the remainder of the Class and the 2900 engines all received roller bearings and stack extensions. The model is a United PFM bought used and painted by air brush last year. Both models have Tsunami sound decoders.




Clinton River Division Layout Open House

Saturday, July 27, 2024 1-4 PM

John Depauw 1303 Ridgeview Circle, Lake Orion, MI 48362

Based on the EJ&E in Chicago in 1973, John's layout depicts the belt railway that linked most of the railroads coming into the Chicago area, including the B&O, Indiana Harbor Belt, Chicago South Shore, N&W, GM&O, NC&P, BN, and others. The layout is large (multi-deck 2000 sq. ft.), and it was constructed with operation in view. John operates regularly, and his sessions have space for 15-20 operators. The layout features coal-hauling, the steel industry, and a large number of subsidiary industries. Most important, his layout features interchanges with the many railroads in the Chicago area.



John Siekirk 9415 Thornhill Drive, Clarkston MI 48348

This free-lanced HO scale layout, the Superior & Seattle RR, depicts the northwest during the steam era. You may have seen John's photography work without realizing it, since he does a lot of the photography for George Sellios' famous Franklin & Manchester layout in the Boston area. John has built virtually all of Sellios' Fine Scale Miniature structures for his layout. He also produces the monthly S&S Railroad Gazette, an online publication featuring both his own work, cameos of George Sellios' railroad, and guest authors.
