One of my favorite ways that I've seen people add interest to their freight trains is to model some open car loads. When I talk about open car loads, I'm talking about flat cars and gondolas and the myriad of products that the railroads transported using these types of freight cars.

One common and interesting type of loads is the shipment of bulk steel and other metals. This can be in the form of sheets or various shapes that would be delivered to a customer for use in manufacturing or construction.

While in the middle of doing some work on my own open car loads, I found a neat little tool that you can use to make sure you don't end up with a model of a 50 ton flat car with 300 tons of steel loaded on it. Below is a link to a tool that will calculate how much those sheets or shapes of steel would weigh so that 50 ton flat car loaded up with steel sheets looks "right". Just select the shape and material you are interested in, along with the dimensions you are thinking for your load, and the calculator will tell you if "We're gonna need a bigger flatcar".

Since moving to Michigan and joining Division 8, I have been able to see great modeling "up close and personal" at both the Show & Tell segments at our monthly meetings and at the many layout tours we have.



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Clinton River Division Layout Open House

Saturday, November 9, 2024 1-4 PM

The focus was to build a layout in a short time with one town and one staging yard. The theme is Santa Fe in Pampa, Texas during 1944. Pampa is along the Santa Fe's Southern freight mainline and is the beginning of a double track section that extends through Amarillo to Canyon, TX. Pampa had Oil and Gas Refineries, Carbon Black Plants, and Pipeline Companies. There was a yard, wye, engine service, freight house, cattle loading, and a branch line to Clinton, OK. The model has a four-track yard, wye, a one stall engine facility, the branch, interchange with the FW&D, and 14 customers. There are more than 60 customer car spots. There are 8 staging tracks for the mainline that hold 30 car freights. Staging also has engine pockets to provide a variety of engines. The branch has two staging tracks that hold 10 car mixed trains. There are 18 sound equipped steam engines, 250 freight cars and 10 passenger cars. Control is Easy DCC.

My Pennsylvania Division of the B&O RR is a fictional division operating in western Pennsylvania and West Virginia after the merging of the B&O and C&O. The railroad serves coal and industrial customers. The era is the 1940s (but with artistic license), and I run both steam and 1st generation diesel locomotives. The emphasis is on capturing the scenery of the area, and the railroad is designed for operations. My inspiration comes from my father, who was a policeman on the B&O in Pittsburgh. As a kid, I often rode the train from Pittsburgh to Detroit and Toledo to visit relatives or sometimes accompanied my father to check cars in a yard or investigate a derailment.

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
