Mark Mincek - NMRA Member Survey Results

Mark presented the results of the recent member survey that was given at a clinic during the National Convention this summer. There was quite a bit of data presented in charts and graphs.

A brief summary showed that:

- Most members see the hobby growing and changing
- Most members are encouraged and optimistic about the future
- The NMRA must deliver more value for the membership fees
- The National organization must help local divisions and regions to be more successful.
- The majority of members are over 50
- Time, family commitments, and costs seem to be among the main reasons for lack of younger members.

A.P. CORNER: So, Where Do I Start?

If you are at all interested in the NMRA's Achievement Program, you might well wonder about how to get started.

A great way to start is to head to your favorite "Comfy Chair" with a cup of hot chocolate or a glass of Egg Nog, and familiarize yourself with the Achievement Program section of the NMRA website. In addition to the requirements for each Certificate, there are some great articles written by members who have worked their way through the program. In addition to reading all that great info, I can share some insights from my years as the NMRA's Education Department Manager. Although each individual's path through the program is unique, I will share with you the three most commonly earned "First Certificates". They are the Golden Spike Certificate, the Association Volunteer Certificate, and the Scenery Certificate. Let's look briefly at these three.

Golden Spike:

Designed as the perfect entry into the program, the Golden Spike Certificate requirements include some basic modeling of rolling stock (cars and motive power), structures, and scenery/trackwork. Almost all of the layouts we have visited in our "Open Houses/Layout Tours" that our Division arranges would qualify for this award many times over.

Association Volunteer:

Many of you consistently volunteer your time to the Division and/or Region serving on committees or holding an office. Before you know it, you have accumulated enough "Certified Time Units" to qualify for this Certificate. So, you have been working in the A.P. Program without even realizing it. I have been talking with a number of you about your service to the organization, and I'm comfortable in predicting that we will have a flurry of Association Volunteer Certificates issued in late winter or early spring in 2025.

Scenery Certificate:

The reason that Scenery is often one of the first certificates earned is that it builds nicely on the requirements of the Golden Spike. In fact, as you work on the Golden Spike, keep an eye on the Scenery Certificate requirements and realize that if you did a little more work here and there, you can earn both at the same time. In fact, I did exactly that. Those were the first two certificates that I earned and they resulted from the same visit by members of the AP evaluation team from the Garden State Division, NER.



Bachman 2-8-0, custom lettered, painted, and weathered.





Bruce De Young Ulrich Flay Car w/load


Picked up thus Ulrich Flat Car in the yard sale room at the NCR convention in October. Bruce assembled it and added a load.

Picture of Larry's O scale SP 4-8-0 Book - Beebe & Clegg – Age of Steam.






Phil D<u>olittle</u> Pared Locos

Our main objectives are to provide events of value, items attendees will see as worth their money, all at the lowest possible cost. ** We will honor the traditions of past conventions but at lower cost and with greater flexibility. ** This convention will be shorter, starting at 1 PM on Monday and continuing through Saturday afternoon with a banquet Saturday evening. ** Note that registration includes all layout visits and operating sessions, and all activities at the hotel except Modeling with the Masters, and admittance to the National Train Show. ** We will support all the traditional activities of the SIG's. ** The National Contest will be fully supported. 
