- To boost scratch building skills

Monthly Newsletter of the **Clinton River Division of** the North Central Region of th NM Bruce has kits from the late 30's. Since many of these kit are paper based, often the materials can not be used, but they are useful for the drawings of the finished model. From these he can scratch build a model for his layout.

Kits can be old or odd and from long lived or obscure kit makers. Kits can also be a restoration project from a kit that has been started. Often the kits may have pieces missing or unusable, so parts may need to be substituted. Other times, he will change the kit to fit with what was left in the box. Bruce showed pictures of many of the kits he has or has worked with.

# AP Corner "Recent Changes to Structures Certificate Requirements"

This month I want to alert you to a recent change to the Structures Certificate requirements. Just as a quick background, to earn this certificate, you have to build twelve (12) structures. Those twelve must include six (6) different kinds of structures. One type of structure must be a bridge or trestle. Also, <u>at least</u> six (6) must be scratch built. The rest must be "super detailed" with either scratch built or commercial details. Finally, at least six (6) of the structures need to earn a Merit Award. At some future time, I will devote a few columns to discuss the Structures Certificate in more detail. We also should talk more about the meaning of "super detailed" – either in a future column or via a clinic. With that background, we can now move on to the changes to the requirements that occurred last summer.

New: Up to three (3) of the twelve (12) total models may be "low-relief" structures, defined as structures without one modeled wall (against the backdrop or open on the aisle) with at least ten (10) scale feet depth (front to back) of side walls and roof that are super-detailed. Flats with no appreciable roofs or side walls are not considered "low-relief" structures and are not eligible. Note1: Background building 'flats' are still not eligible to be used. Neither are background structures 4

with a depth of less than ten (10) feet.

Note 2: A structure "... open to the isle" refers to a structure with a wall left off (and facing the isle) so that a visitor can see the interior of the structure and its detailing.


I had a number of background buildings on my layout in New Jersey, several were scratch built, some kit built, and one kit-bashed. Since I earned my Structures Certificate in 2008, none of those were eligible to be in the mix for the twelve (12) structures needed.

Let's finish up with some pictures of a couple of my background buildings.


This commercial kit has the 10' depth, but is not "super detailed".




This nice structure is made from commercial plaster casting and is nicely detailed. However, it lacks the required ten (10) scale feet in depth to count.



This scratch build Company Store is 13' in depth and would now qualify.





Finally, here is another of my scratch builds that would now qualify for the Structures Certificate.

So, there's a look at the latest change to the Structures Certificate options. One that I think makes a lot of sense.

In conclusion, many of us check out the requirements for a particular certificate (and even print out the necessary forms), but then take several years to complete the work. I encourage you to check back on the NMRA website from time to time to make sure that the requirements and forms for the certificates that you are working on have not changed in the interim. ### **Hints and Tips**

- When using newly purchased electronics, use a meter to check that everything is compatible. A power supply like a "wall wart" can put out a different voltage than the rated amount depending on the current draw, sso use a meter to check what the output is.




